I had a recent beaver job I was doing for the DNR. It was on an impoundment that had been dammed up by beavers for years. As we entered into the area the DNR tech and myself noticed some beaver sign. Not much but enough to try to help them out. So the DNR tech asked me where I wanted holes chopped in the dam. I set up six 330's deep enough not to be bothered by freeze up. I went back the next day and everything was froze over. In a light dusting of snow on the ice, there was some tracks on the ice. They were like nothing I've ever seen before. It appeared to be something big and dragging a tail. Not a beaver, so I guessed it must be an otter. Not knowing what their tracks even look like. The next day when I returned I could see something in one of my traps- not a beaver, but a big otter! It felt awesome. I'm no longer a otter virgin!

So what little I know about otters, I figured they usually have a partner. I need to draw them up into my traps, so I squirted some fish oil on the ice and in the water where the dam was chopped out, so it would go down stream and maybe get the other otter to come, the next day yup another large otter! After 50 plus years of trapping I'm no longer a otter virgin for sure. Sometimes it takes a lifetime to accomplish things you thought you'd be able to do.

Even though I never got any beaver out of all of this, the DNR biologist figured the beavers probably moved out due to the lack of abundance of food source. It was still an awesome experience to catch those otters. I would like to thank the DNR for their trust in me to help them out over the years with trapping issues. I still have a lot to look forward to-I'm still a bobcat, badger, marten, and fisher virgin. As trappers we all know that everyday on the line is like Christmas, it always has its surprise's! Tight chains to you all and have an awesome experience everyday,
