President's Report

Well, we have finished another year and what a year it was. This year has been a true test of our way of life both as an American and as a trapper. First, we lost our privileges to eat, drink and be merry. Then we lost the opportunity to socialize with our fellow trappers. Hopefully with the new year we will be able to regain these things that have been taken away from us.

I would like to bring you attention to three things that are going on. First, the wolf has been delisted as of 4 Jan 2021, there has been a letter of intent filed to the DNR in that the next day several groups will be filing to get a hold of the delisting at least in Michigan. The DNR does not plan on doing anything with the wolves until this court case is resolved or does not get filed. So, in other words don't plan on a wolf season this year. The second item is last month a request was sent to MUCC policy board to get a resolution to require all traps on land to be marked in a way to let the general public know where they were. Thanks to work by Dale Hendershott and Chris Kettler this request was DEFEATED unanimously by the wildlife committee. But rumor has it that this might come back just reworded. We will be on the lookout for it. The third item is about a house bill in the federal government. The bill is HR8828 "Public Safety and Wildlife Protection Act". Basically, this bill makes it illegal for the transportation of any steel trap across state lines. The bill never made it out of committee but will be reintroduced next session. Please contact your federal representative and let the Rep know that you are opposed to this type of legislation.

The last thing I would like to bring up is probably a broken record for some but WE NEED VOLUNTEERS. This includes conventions, show, and fur sales (yes, we will have them again), so please contact one of the board members to help out. We are also looking for personnel to fill positions on the board most of our board members have been there awhile so some fresh insight would be appreciated.

Letter from the Editor:

Hello Trappers and Callers!

You may remember this quote from the last Trapline. "I coyote trapped for a few days several years ago and took eight so I'm hoping to do as well this time." Well it didn't turn out that way. IK caught a bunch of other critters (coons, a badger and possums) but the coyotes avoided my traps. The only thing I can think of was the brand new underalls I used were contaminated. I even had a coyote pull one out from under the pan and leave it on top of the unfired trap!

To sooth my wounded pride I went back to my first love- beaver trapping. At the time of this writing, I'm at 45 for the season. Mostly doing damage control locations. I even had a couple smart ones that were firing my bodygrippers and avoiding my footholds as well as the coyotes had been. One took me three weeks to catch but I got him (a 68lb. male). I had caught his 72lb. mate a few days earlier. It's never taken me that long to catch a beaver. I have one more pond where the beavers are square-shy and, unfortunately, there's not enough water for effective drowning sets. I'd do snares under the ice but the pond is a couple miles down a seasonal road and it's too far to walk towing a sled full of beaver equipment- I'm not that mad at them!

I will say that the down market has made spending time chasing these smart critters easier to enjoy. It's fun (and occasionally frustrating) taking on the challenge! If you've never matched wits with a trap shy beaver it can be a humbling and thought-provoking experience. Remember a beaver knows every inch of its pond; and you making a set in it is like someone rearranging the furniture in your living room- you notice it the second you walk in the room. When beaver aren't shy this can be used to attract them. When they are shy, this puts them on high alert. If you want to know how I caught them- ask me at Convention. We'll pour some apple pie and I'll tell you the whole sordid tale- because the misses are the educational part!

Bobcat RUB lure: 4 oz. Ground Beaver Castor 4 Drops Mink Musk 1 oz. Liquid Smoke

Mix well. Let set for 60 days in a cool room. Place on a small stump or tree approximtely. 10" from the ground.
