Hello everybody! Allow me to introduce myself. I'm Merle Jones from Kalamazoo, MI. I grew up on my family's farm on the far west side and went to the (then) small town school of Mattawan. Like so many I was raised hunting and fishing but I have to admit I've done very little in the way of formal trapping. My family has been on the same dirt since the 1880's. I grew up with dairy and crop farming and we owned a mechanical contracting company. Before I could drive, I was already participating in the local fire department which led to a 30 year career with the Grand Rapids Fire Dept which I will be completely retired from in the first quarter of next year.

In 2016 I learned about MTPCA, MUCCC and the NRC through my involvement with Bob Abbot's group "Michigan Predator Hunters for Centerfire at Night" which then led to my membership in MTPCA and my current position as your Public Relations Director. My job description is to "Act as the liaison between MTPCA, the Press, the DNR, the Natural Resources Commission, and the Legislature...". Fortunately, I have quite a bit of control over my schedule and am able to attend wherever as deemed necessary. My intention is to attend all the monthly Natural Resources Commission meetings and then decide on other events as needed.

As a coyote hunter and predator caller I have become acutely aware of efforts from special interest groups such as Project Coyote https://projectcoyote.org/ Wolf
